Maxine L. (Whetham) Kaul was born December 28, 1930 near Lynch, in rural Boyd County, Nebraska. The first child of Robert Edgar and Vada Izora Long Whetham, she weighed 4 pounds 2 ounces at birth and was given the middle names of her two aunt Helens. Maxine graduated from Spencer High School in 1948 with a certificate in teaching third grade. She taught for one and a half years before marrying the love of her life, Gerald "Mort" Reinhold Kaul. The two were married in Seward, Nebraska in 1950 and later that year Maxine gave birth to their first child, Leland Lee. The family then moved to Chadron, Nebraska, where in 1953 Mort finished his degree in Elementary Education. That same year they welcomed their second child, Gregory Allen and moved to Newcastle, Wyoming. It was in Newcastle that their last two children were born: Janet Marie, their only daughter, in 1955 and Kelly Joe in 1960. Among her many interests and pursuits, Maxine's love of history stands out most of all.
