
Why Story Maps and XR Applications?

Story Maps are excellent accessible tools for sharing spatially-infused data layers. XR technologies offer novel and immersive ways to visualize data. Both provide interactive elements and presented solutions for crafting accessible, interactive, and immersive experiences on Ash Grove.

Ash Grove Historic Site

Archaeological work was completed at Ash Grove Historic Site, a Fairfax County Park located in Tysons, Virginia containing a 18th century manor home constructed by Thomas Fairfax the 6th of the county's founding Fairfax family. This work was completed prior to the initiation of the county's Resident Curator program, a program that places curators in select county historic homes.





contains one of Fairfax county's few extant 18th century manor homes, constructed by Thomas Fairfax of the county's founding Fairfax family and occupied by the Fairfax until 1851.

The Federal style manor home at Ash Grove Historic Site is a 2.5 story center hall house, this property currently listed in Fairfax County's Resident Curator program. In addition to the home several other early extant structures remain on the property including a kitchen and meathouse just east of the

This story map will highlight archaeological investigations and findings from this research and detail histories tied to the people who have lived and worked at Ash Grove Historic Site.
