Station Profile

This station is a non-profit, non-commercial, educational station licensed to the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Hawkeye, Iowa. The studio and tower are located at 12251 175th Street, three miles north of Fayette, Iowa. The operating frequency is 89.9 FM. Our station signal covers Fayette County, Iowa and parts of 4 surrounding counties. It is the only non-commercial station in Fayette County.

The studio will be open from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Monday through Thursday and 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM Friday.

Mission Statement

It is the mission of KRJE to serve the public by providing Christian and family oriented programming and to spread the good news of salvation in Jesus Christ as presented by the truth in the Bible. Our goals are:

1. To provide religious instruction and moral teaching.
2. To teach parents and children principles for strengthening the home.
3. To help members of the community discover solutions to the personal, social, relational and health problems typical of contemporary times.
4. To provide opportunity for and to promote discussion of all areas of family, contemporary, social, religious and personal life issues.
5. To teach the ideals of citizenship, integrity, personal responsibility, moral rectitude and spiritual maturity.
6. To provide spiritually uplifting sacred traditional music.

Programming

It is the desire of KRJE to broadcast programming which presents the gospel of Jesus Christ and the truths of the Bible and gives positive Christian values for life. Programming will follow Christian guidelines and standards as set forth by the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

All guests who are invited to participate in the programs broadcast by KRJE need to be approved by the station board prior to broadcast.

This station does not editorialize or produce spots containing promos or accept political candidate underwriting. KRJE holds a nonpartisan position in all political debates, and will not offer airtime to political candidates.

KRJE will make air time available for announcements that concern the community, providing such announcements meet the following criteria:

- (a) The sponsoring organization is non-profit as defined by the IRS.
- (b) The content can be edited for content and length.
- (c) Is in agreement with station policy.

Examples of such announcements would be

- (a) Emergency and public safety.
- (b) Community calendar.

Copyright. KRJE holds music broadcast licenses from ASCAP, BMI, SESAC. Only music covered by these licenses or that is in the public domain or material that has been cleared for use by the owner may be used for broadcast.

Music Guidelines

"So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God."--
1 Corinthians 10:31

"Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is pure, whatever is right, whatever is admirable--if anything is excellent or praiseworthy--think about such things."--
Phil 4:8

On these two foundations--glorifying God in all things and choosing the noblest and the best--depend the other principles listed below for our selection of music.

1. Music should be characterized by quality, balance, appropriateness, and authenticity.
2. Music should foster our spiritual, psychological and social sensitivity, and our intellectual growth. It should maintain a judicious balance of spiritual, intellectual, and emotional elements.
3. Music is holistic and should appeal to both the intellect and the emotions and impacts the body in a positive way.
4. Music reveals creativity in that it draws from quality melodies. If harmonized, it uses harmonies in an interesting and artistic way, and employs rhythm that complements them without using heavy syncopation and beat.
5. Vocal music should employ lyrics that positively stimulate intellectual abilities as well as our emotions and our will power. Good lyrics are creative, rich in content, and of good composition. They focus on the positive and reflect moral values; they educate and uplift; and they correspond with sound biblical theology.
6. Musical and lyrical elements should work together harmoniously to influence thinking and behavior in harmony with biblical values.

FCC Rules and Regulations

As an NCE (non-profit, non-commercial, educational) broadcast station we come under a number of FCC rules and regulations. Station policy is to comply with these rules and regulations as follows:

1. PUBLIC INTEREST. All radio stations licensed by the FCC are assigned a community of license. For KRJE it is Hawkeye, Iowa. The Federal Communications Commission requires an NCE station to “operate in the public interest” and to show responsiveness to the community’s needs.
2. INDECENT MATERIAL. The station may not be used for the creation of, or transmission of obscene, illegal, indecent or offensive material.
3. STATION LOGS. All station logs will be signed and dated by the person in charge, and checked at least once a week by the Chief Operator.
4. BUSINESS OPERATIONS. The station will operate under sound business rules and practices of the State of Iowa.
5. DONATIONS. All donation and gifts to KRJE will be come property of the station and will be documented and become part of the quarterly and yearly report.
6. FCC INSPECTIONS. The FCC may request to inspect the station at any time. It is expected that they will call the station first before they come.
7. STATION ID. The FCC requires that all stations give station ID at the beginning of the broadcast day and every hour as close to the top of the hour as possible. The ID should consist of the call letters followed immediately by the community of license. Example: “This is KRJE, Hawkeye, Iowa.” Any additions should appear at the end of this ID. Example: “This is KRJE, Hawkeye, Iowa, broadcasting on a frequency of 89.9 FM.”
8. PUBLIC INSPECTION. Public access to the public inspection file will be permitted during normal working hours, or by appointment with station management. Public inspection file material may not be removed from the station at any time. Public may request copies of the public files. Station may request identification of any person asking for public file information. The station must comply with any request for public file information made in person. Public file information may also be obtained from the Web site: www.krje-radioforjesus.org
9. EAS. KRJE sends and receives all required weekly tests (RWT) of the Emergency Alert System (EAS). Once a month the we relay the required monthly test (RMT) from LP1 KFMW or LP2 KNWS. We also monitor the National Weather Service (NWS) on LP5.
