Michael Joseph Mathern, age 70, passed away unexpectedly on May 4, 2024, at his home in Solen.

Michael, known to his grandchildren as Papa Farm, was born August 25, 1953, in Mandan to Joseph and Katherine (Manolovitz) Mathern. He was raised on the family farm south of Solen. He graduated from Fort Yates High School and attended ND State College of Science in Wahpeton, ND. After college he came back home to help his dad with the family dairy farm and worked at Farmers Union in Selfridge. Eventually, Mike took

over his family business on June 9, 1976, and continued his lifelong career in farming and ranching.
