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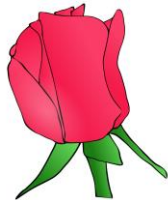
From Pastor Worf

Happy Sabbath, and welcome to the Clark Fork Seventh-day Adventist Church. Today we're digging into the last part of 1 Peter 2 & 3 to examine the role of submission in a Christian's life, and also to understand more about how Peter intends for the church to respond to adversity and abuse.

The North American Division has designated the last Sabbath in August as #EndItNow Sabbath. On average, 20 people a minute are physically abused by an intimate partner in the United States. One in three women and one in four men have been victims of physical violence by an intimate partner in their lifetime. Emotional, verbal, sexual, and spiritual abuse are present in an even higher percentage of intimate relationships. As we explore Peter's counsel to a church experiencing persecution, let's look inward and make sure that we are not a persecutor of our own family members. May God grant us repentance for the harm we do to others because of our sinful hearts, humility to admit we are wrong and seek help from Him and others, and love for those He has called us to give our lives for.
