and the skills to avoid them.

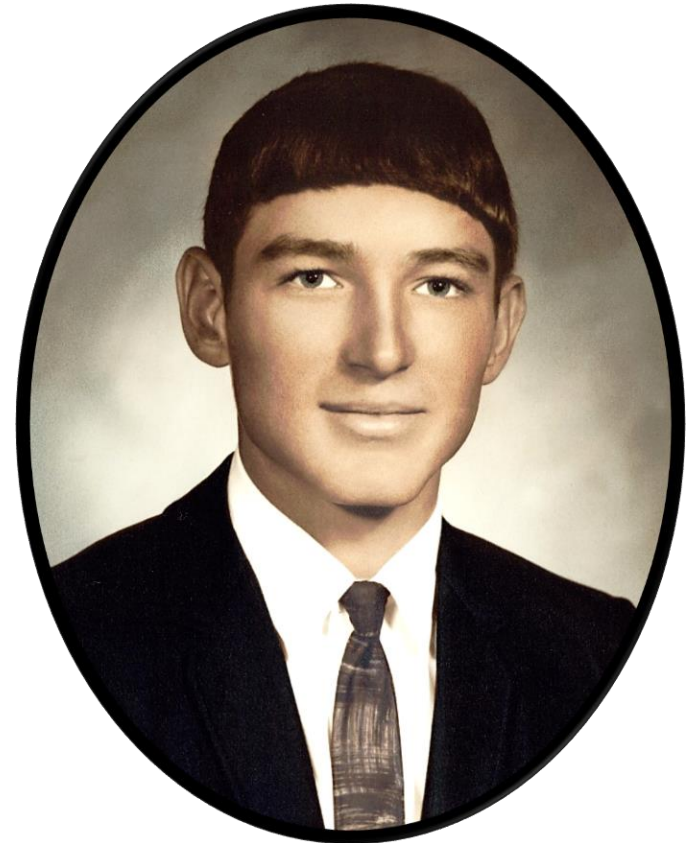
Grant me the ambition to work hard,
