Attached there is an example Metro Heat Map from the 2018 SportAUS participation data. This is the first example of the methodology we have followed in applying the previously audited facility data George reviewed in Q1 2019.

It will take a little time to iron out some issues with the interface and data, but the attached will give you a snap shot of what it looks like when applied.

This will form the core of the data that will go in to all State Facility Plans and future squash facility applications.

4. State Investment Agreements

The State Investment Agreements (SIA) were due on the 1st August, thanks to those who have returned them with all the data they contain. Mark Mclatchy will reach out to everyone and help where needed to complete.

The SIA is not compulsory to sign. They are simply a means of reporting back data needed for Sport Australia funding and Insurance purposes; and they provide information for Squash Australia to provide the State funding and equipment against measures of strategic delivery.

The SIA serves a number of other purposes:

1st they allow us to receive an update on your current board and staff contacts. Else we do not know about changes and communications don't get through to the right person. This is the one point to ensure we get the right people to be in contact with.

2nd they provide us with your latest strategies or facility plans. Else we do not know about them;

3rd they confirm to us your various participation numbers which you record. These are needed for the Sport Australia reporting due in October which in turn impacts the funding going in to the sport and for the insurance renewal which will be prepared in the October window for 2019, without these numbers we cannot run the numbers to get quotes around insurance. 6. Regulation Review - Regulation 5 - Financial Guidelines Policy

The Squash Australia Board have made some minor changes to Regulation 5 – Financial Guidelines Policy which was due for updating. The away from home allowance as been increased by \$10 from \$50 to \$60 a day and there has been some stipulations added for part day allowances where individuals are not away from home all day. There are no other changes.

11. New Service - Facility Grant Writing Services

Over the past three years the funding avenues across Australia has been transformed at National, State and local levels. Now more than ever there are avenues open to local facility owners and managers based on strategic health and participant experience outcomes. Many of the traditional national and State core funding pots have been opened up to everyone within the health, entertainment and exercise sector under targeted grants.

Squash Australia has investigated the development of a national resource of a consultancy grant writing service which can support the grant applications of facilities across Australia, aimed to increase the total money coming in to the sport as a whole.

This will be a free service but there will be an application process against a strategic criteria as we anticipate more applications than we can support.

The first round of these application should be open for September and more news will follow.
