
I'm Free

It is with sad and heavy hearts that we announce the passing of Alvin "Dean" Harrenstein, who passed away on Thursday, October 22, 2020 at UnityPoint Health-Allen Memorial Hospital in Waterloo. He fought hard, but ultimately succumbed from complications of surgery. A private service for Dean will be held and burial will take place at Oak Hill Cemetery in Parkersburg.

Dean was born on January 27, 1946, in Marshalltown, the son of Alvin G. & Grace (Beenken) Harrenstein. He grew up in Grundy Center, and graduated from Grundy Center High School in 1964.
