Wound care stated today that the wounds on his feet from poor circulation may be pretty deep, but there is no way to tell at this point. They are both blistering badly, especially his right foot, and the doctors are considering taking a culture of the fluid in the blister to see if there is any bacteria present that may be making things worse. Let's pray that the wound care physicians have wisdom for how to best treat his feet. Thank you for love and prayers!!
