Duane “Snook” Phillip Barrett, Sr. of Osakis, MN passed away peacefully March 1, 2024, at 86 years of age. He was born on March 14, 1937 in Osakis, MN to Phillip and MaryJane Barrett. He was the oldest of 5 boys: Denny, Tom, Amos, and Charlie.

He is survived by his boys: Duane Jr. (Gail), Robert, and Mark (Tonya) and his brothers Amos, Charlie (Betty).
