ABIM will provide your name to the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) for listing in *The Official ABMS Directory of Board Certified Medical Specialists*. ABMS will send you a form soliciting the information as you would like it to appear in your listing.

Maintenance of Certification (MOC) is now a continuous process that offers you a structured framework for keeping up with and assessing your knowledge of the latest scientific developments in your specialty. The certificate you just earned in Hospice and Palliative Medicine will remain valid as long as you are meeting the requirements of the MOC program (i.e., comincensly engaging in MOC activities).

To remain certified in Hospice and Palliative Medicine and to be reported as "Certified, Meeting MOC Requirements," you will need to log in and select Hospice and Palliative Medicine in addition to the others you choose to maintain by March 31, 2015. Many specialties do not require you to maintain your underlying internal medicine certification. Visit abim.org/requirements to learn more. Please note:

- If you were in fellowship in 2014, you will not be required to pay any enrollment fees as you earned a fee credit for 2015 for your fellowship.
- If you were not in fellowship in 2014, you will need to pay an enrollment fee to add this certification area.
- You are also eligible to claim *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits*TM directly from the AMA for earning your certification. As documentation of your ABIM Board Certification, the AMA will require a copy of this letter. For details, go to abim.org/certification and choose "Claim CME Credit."
