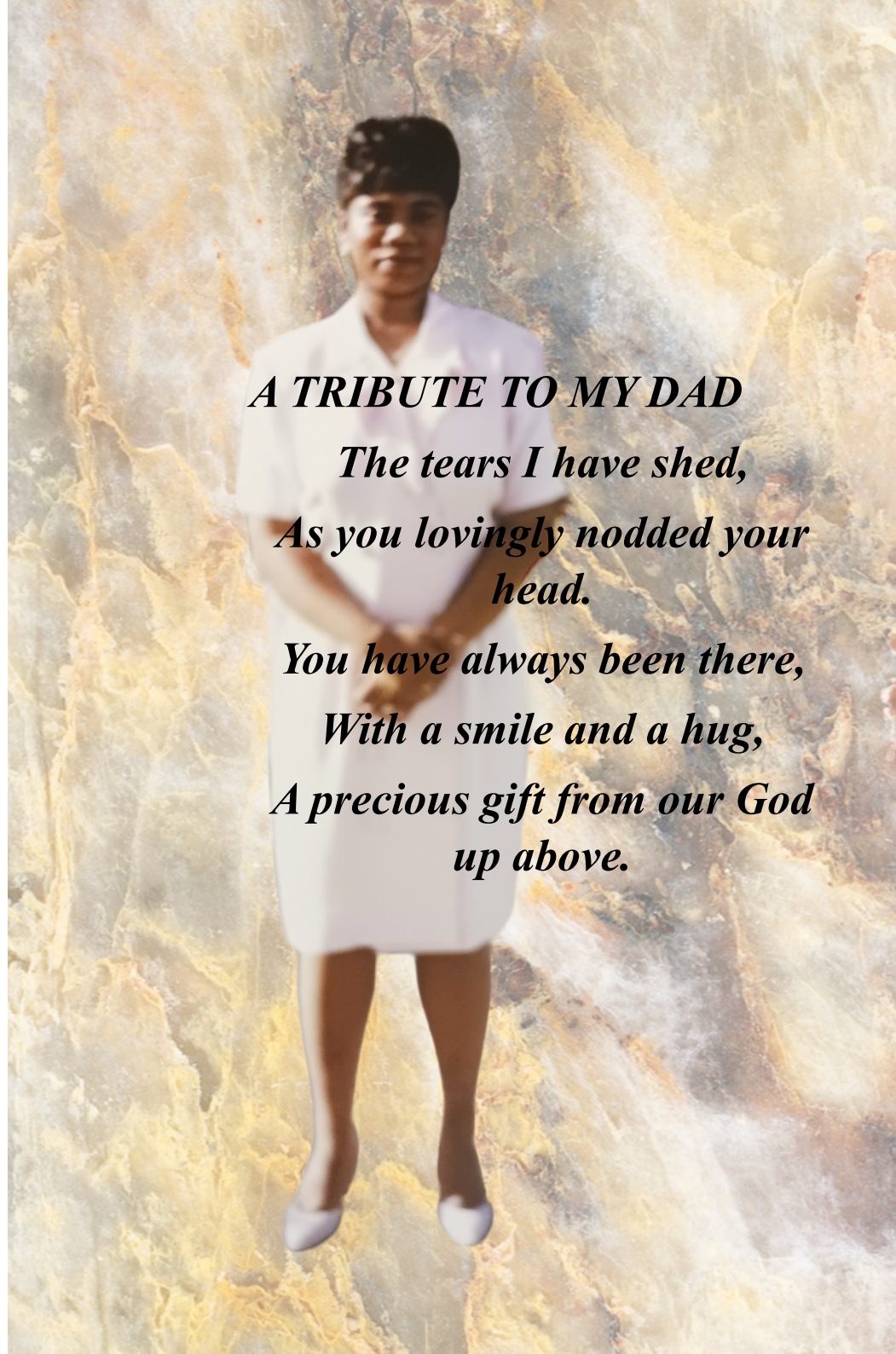

Wilburt courageously served in Vietnam, earning the esteemed rank of Sergeant and received numerous commendations for his dedicated service. Upon returning home, he pursued his education and received a degree from Savannah State College. Following his tenure with Grumman, Wilburt's professional path led him to CSX Railroad, where he flourished as a diligent conductor for more than 25 years until his well-deserved retirement. Bowling was his hobby where he obtained spots on several leagues and received numerous trophies.

On January 14, 2024, Wilburt went home to be with the Lord. Wilburt was preceded in death by his mother Ruby Clark, father Leophas Clark, stepmother, Charlie Mae Clark, son Wilburt Clark Jr., and brother Lepolder Clark. 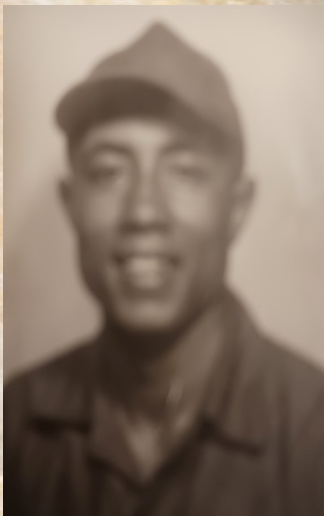
