

Virginia Lee Lindberg Clifford, 89, died August 25, 2015 at her home surrounded by family. She was born June 4, 1926 in Lexington, KY to the late Harry and Virginia Mae Finnell Lindberg. She was very proud of her Swedish and Irish heritage.
