Louise was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, but raised in Berlin, New Jersey. She was educated in New Jersey School Districts.

Louise accepted Christ as her Lord and personal savior at a young age and attended True Vine Baptist Church in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
