



Orion Cinema - Dereham in Dereham Market Place has special FREE screenings of silent films shot between 1936 and 1939 depicting aspects of life in Dereham at that time. The films have been

captioned by local historian, Brent Scholes, are the property of the East Anglia Film Archive. They have probably not been seen in public for 80 years. There will be 3 screenings during the afternoon, each one FREE and lasting approximately 30 minutes. Our beautiful medieval Parish St. Nicholas Church, East Dereham is open daily between 10 o'clock in the morning and 4pm. You are welcome to visit and enjoy a time of quiet reflection in the church and churchyard, to see the ancient Withburga



Well, the fifteenth century font, and the memorial window to William Cowper, the eighteenth century poet who is buried in the church.

Dereham History & Bishop Bonner's Cottage Museum houses the town museum and is open on Fridays (10-1) and Saturdays (10-4) until the end of September. It is a little gem!

Dereham Windmill was built in 1835 and is a five storey brick tower mill, with cap and sails. It is open to visitors every Friday and Saturday between 10 and 3pm.

The Partea Hut serves light meals, cakes and beverages from 10 o'clock daily on Wednesdays till Sunday in a lovely spot next to Dereham Windmill.

Dereham Town Football Club would be with us, but it's graduation day at Aldiss Park at Dereham Town Football Club. The under 16s team is playing on the main pitch, and they have a BBQ.

And, don't forget that Gressenhall Farm and Workhouse Museum is on our doorstep!
