In 2 Chronicles 20, Judah is being attacked by its enemies. The king, Jehoshaphat, called all the people to come to Jerusalem to fast and seek the Lord's help. Jehoshaphat prayed to God there among the people and he said these words: "We have no power to face this vast army that is attacking us. We do not know what to do, but our eyes are on you."

God told them not to be afraid or discouraged because this battle is not yours it is the Lord's and they all bowed down to the ground and worshipped God. Jehoshaphat appointed men to sing to the Lord and to praise Him for the splendour of his holiness as they went out at the head of the army, saying "Give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures forever." As they began to sing and praise, the Lord set ambushes against the men who were invading Judah, and they were defeated.

Our world, our neighbourhoods and people's lives are all being attacked. Some by physical enemies in wars and conflicts, or by natural disasters which devastate lives and land, or by societal breakdown, poverty, greed or inequality of power. God is still God, we can seek his face, bow in prayer, say with the people of Judah, "we don't know what to do, but our eyes are on you," and then praise God for the answers he will reveal.

Bring to God in prayer now the things that are pressing in on you; in the world, in our nation or in your own or family life, and then keep your eyes on God, not the problem. And praise Him because He's still God.

Please pray for our churches, and St Andrew's in particular, that as we see the huge needs around us, and *don't know what to do*, that we will pray and *keep our eyes on God* not the size of the problems or the current lack of resources. And Praise HIM!


