Unseen, unheard but always near Still loved, still missed and very dear.







Carl Patrick Connellan, a cherished member of his community and a devoted family man, passed away on October 18, 2024 in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania. He was born on March 30, 1932, in Dublin, Ireland, and lived a life rich with varied experiences, passions, and unwavering commitment to those he loved.

Carl's career was as varied as it was impressive. Initially managing horse racing stables and pop music bands, he also entertained many as a magician and drummer. His profound love for aviation led him to Aer Lingus, a job that originally brought him to America for a week-long assignment in 1958. The United States ultimately became his forever home where he met his wife, Joanne, and raised a family.

Carl held executive roles at Collector's Guild, Book of the Month Club, and PBS. Not one to settle into retirement, he embarked on a new adventure and spent over 20 years as a Law Clerk for Judge Ed Guido, where he was recognized as the oldest active Law Clerk in the country.
