Jollie Hue Britt was born on July 15, 1944, in New York City, New York, to his parents, Jollie H. Britt, Sr., and Susie Stokes Britt. He was the only child born in the family. Jollie received his formal education by graduating from Central High School in Victoria, Virginia. He furthered his education by attending Oklahoma State University and Texas A&M University.

Jollie enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1962. He was stationed on many bases, both foreign and domestic, during his tour of duty. He received numerous awards and citations for meritorious service. He served as part of the Fire Prevention Organization. During his military career, he also ran several marathons. Jollie served with honor and distinction and was honorably discharged at the rank of SSgt after serving for twenty years.

Jollie was a fun-loving man who enjoyed life and those he encircled. He enjoyed RV traveling, cookouts, NFL football, college football, basketball, hockey, baseball, fishing, and watching cooking shows in his free time. His closest friend, Charles, will miss his cooking, fishing, and grilling. He will be missed by all who were fortunate enough to have known this kind and wonderful man.
