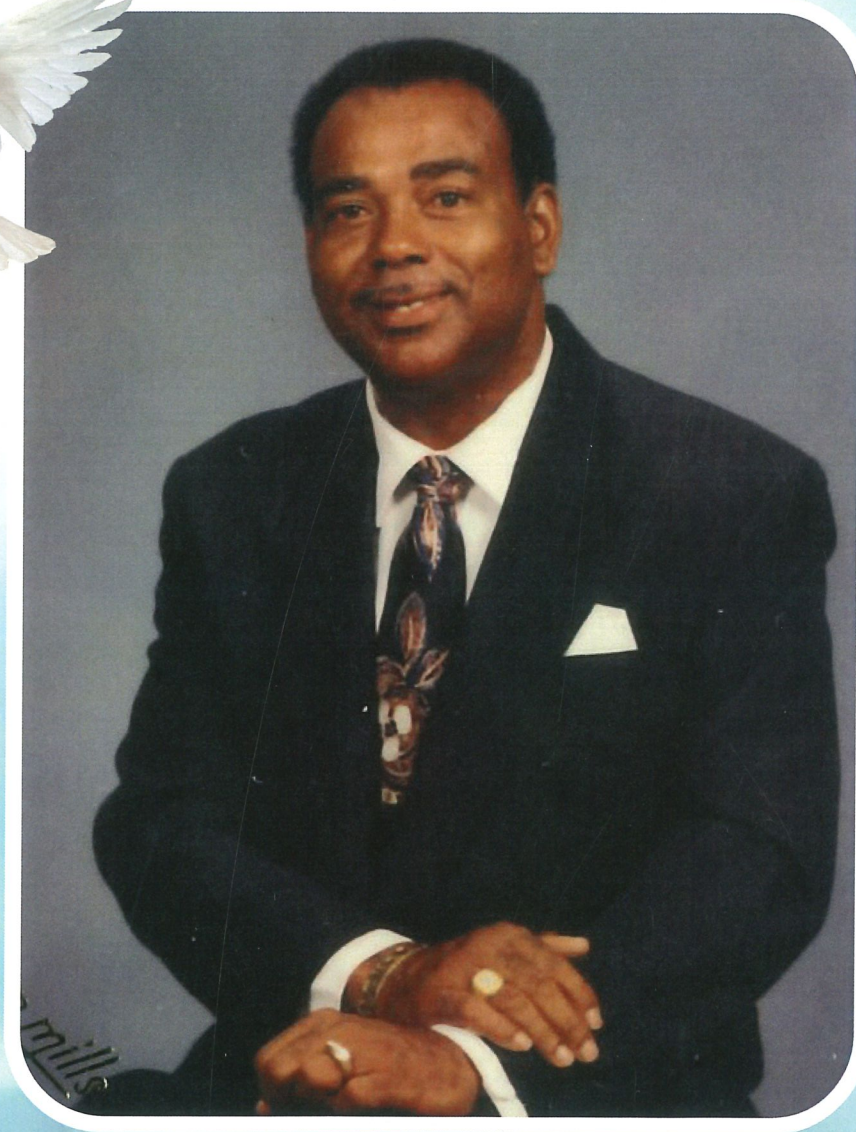

# Obituary

*Davis Roosevelt Peart was born on December 03, 1941, in Panama City, Republic of Panama, to the late Rupert Peart and Beatrice Namard. He was the third of three children produced by this union, earning him the nickname, "Baby."*

*Despite a humble beginning, Dave persevered by using his public-school education and lessons learned from life's experiences to achieve successful military and civilian careers. Dave entered the United States Army in April of 1966 and retired in May of 1999. The Army broadened Dave's horizons with Tours of Duty to include Fort Jackson (South Carolina), Fort Campbell (Kentucky), Fort Clayton (Panama Canal Zone), Fort Bragg (North Carolina), Fort Hood (Killeen, Texas), Camp Humphreys (Pyeongtaek, South Korea), Camp Darby (Nurnberg, Germany) and Fort Bliss (El Paso, Texas). Dave's Military Occupational Specialties centered largely in Logistics / Supply Support. With proven leadership abilities, he ascended the ranks of the military and attained the rank of First Sergeant during his final overseas tour. During his rewarding military career, ISG Peart also managed to earn a college degree.*

*Dave is also a retiree of the City of El Paso where he held a supervisory position. Dave practiced his Catholic faith at the Fort Bliss Chapel 2 Church where he held the position of Usher for almost two decades. Dave understood the importance of serving our Lord and giving of his time, talents and treasures.*

*As the saying goes: "Behind every successful man, there is a strong woman." Truer words were never spoken pertaining to the union of Davis and Carlota Peart. Loving, dedicated and supportive, Carlota, without question, was the main ingredient providing the stability, encouragement and assistance necessary to achieve success. They fell in love as teenagers, and together, their marriage of fifty- eight years produced four children.*

*Surrounded by family and friends, Dave was the life of the party. His outgoing and larger-than-life personality meant that wherever he was, a good time was not far behind. Dave loved to fish, play racquetball, grill outdoors and socialize with family and friends. Dave spent hours watching boxing, soccer, baseball and football on television.*

*Dave's was the loudest voice and strongest cheer at any of the kids' events. Davis was preceded in death by his parents and by his brother, Christopher Peart, Sr., and is survived by his wife, Carlota; daughters Sonia Brown (Anthony) and Zulema Bryant; sons Roberto Peart, Sr. (Kare'n) and George Peart; grandchildren Qwen-nia Vaughen, Andre Brown and Roberto Peart, Jr. (RJ); great grandchild, Chancellor Allen (CJ); brother Norman Peart and a host of cousins, nieces, nephews, other family members and friends.*
