Following his retirement Mike was able to return often to his farm in Hunt's Bend. Peaceful evenings were enjoyed on the front porch in his rocking chair. He embarked upon a new career in the mortuary business and last week earned his apprenticeship II with the support of his comrade Wade Hughes. Mike truly enjoyed his new family at Hardy & Son Funeral Homes. During the past 12 months Mike felt it was an honor to be able to help those suffering from loss. His goal was for all of Warren County to know of the integrity, professionalism, Christian ethics and quality of service that was provided by Bill, Wade, Faye and Betty on the north side of the river.
