

TIMOTHY VINCENT KINSEY was born on January 1, 1964, to Joseph and Ruth (Frazier) Kinsey in Philadelphia, PA at Temple University Hospital. Timothy, better known and called Tim, was raised in North Philadelphia with his older siblings Joseph and Amelia. At a young age, Tim and his siblings father died, but all the siblings developed an even tighter bond under the leadership

of their mother Ruth. During his adolescent years, Tim had a love for baseball cards and building fixtures with Legos/Blocks; he was very meticulous with his hobbies, making sure it was always in order and placed properly. Ultimately, his habits influenced his career endeavors.

Timothy accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as his personal savior in his youth. He was an active member of Thankful Baptist Church and was baptized under the late Rev. Ivan B. Hewitt. His mother Ruth would have him participate in church services and be involved in programs and initiatives that the church would conduct. Tim was a product of the Philadelphia School District.

He attended Simon Gratz High school. At Simon Gratz High School, he excelled in and outside of the classroom. He was not only an exceptional student, but an athlete as well. He was a varsity athlete in the following sports: wrestling, football, and basketball. In addition, Tim was employed as an intern for the US Navy as a civilian engineer in high school. Furthermore, Tim made his family extremely proud and graduated with the highest honor as class valedictorian and earned a full scholarship to Howard University.

After Tim graduated from Simon Gratz High School in 1981, he matriculated at Howard University and earned a Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering. Immediately after graduating Tim worked for the Naval Supply Systems Command (NAVSUP) as an Electrical Engineer until his health declined. As the years went on, unfortunately Tim was diagnosed with congestive heart failure. This condition prevented him from continuing his job as an electrical engineer. Nevertheless, Tim continued to work at PennDOT motor vehicle services as a driver's license examiner assistant.

Tim had a passion for sports and holiday parades. He was an all-Philadelphia sports team fan. His favorite teams he would always support and watch were the Phillies and the Philadelphia Eagles. In previous years, Tim would attend games and not only attend but participate and lead in some holiday parade assignments. He enjoyed volunteering with his children at the 6abc/Dunkin' Thanksgiving parade.
