After he had said this, we were again reminded that our hearts were still grieving for all our friends and family members from Paradise who were affected by the fire. Many of them are homeless and have lost everything. We were grieving for Paradise itself too. So much of it was consumed by the fire. Our old neighborhood, gone. The store where we did most of our grocery shopping, gone. The park where we took family pictures, gone. The DMV where I did my driving test and received my first driver’s license, gone. The church where I was baptized, gone. I have heard many people talk about what a tragedy this has been. What do the people of Paradise really have to be thankful for this season?

I would like to bring your attention to something I discovered in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-17 that has helped change my perspective on what it means to be thankful. I have included both the NIV and the KJV so you can read and compare the two versions. Focusing on the part about giving thanks, I prefer to look at the KJV because I believe it makes this point a little clearer. Do you see what it says there? Does it say, “When times are good give thanks”? Or even, “Only give thanks for the things that are going well in your life”? No. It says “In EVERYTHING give thanks.” We are called to be thankful for the trials of life too, for it is out of trials that faith will grow by leaAps and bounds.
