Dr. Stan Hudson, with the Creation Study Center at the NPUC, invites you to the museum Open House on Sabbath, October 27, 2-5 p.m.

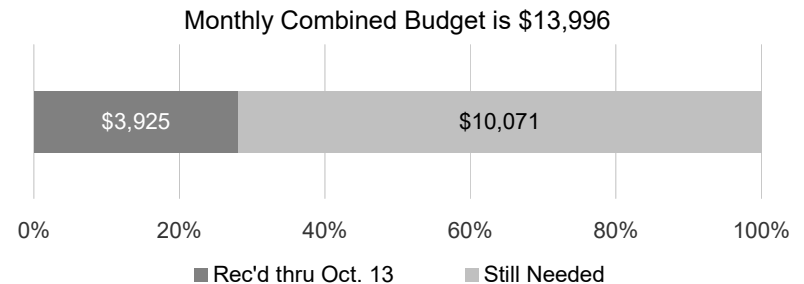

CHURCH GIVING
