We are practicing a lot of new procedures that require self-discipline! **Ellen White** wrote in the book *Education*, "The object of discipline is the training of the child for self-government. He (the child) should be taught self-reliance and self-control." **Marie Montessori** wrote, "We call an individual disciplined when he is master of himself, and can, therefore, regulate his own conduct when it shall be necessary to follow some rule of life. Such a concept of active discipline is not easy either to comprehend or to apply." Our second goal this year is to discipline ourselves. (The first goal is to Depend On God). As these goals are attempted and practiced your children will be free to advance in every subject area!
