Livestreaming will take place in the main services held at Ss Philip & James. If you do not want your or your child's image captured on camera, please speak to the priest before the service. The camera is located at the back of the church so those seated towards the rear are less likely to be filmed.

Photography within services may only take place where permission has been previously given. To maintain the dignity and privacy of our worship, we respectfully ask that you refrain from taking pictures during the service.

Children are welcome to any service at Ss Philip & James and St Stephen's, but we do urge parents and carers to be vigilant of the dangers that exist in church buildings, in particular the steps to the pulpits, the sanctuary, and lit candles.

New Testament Reading – *the second reading is written in the third chapter of the Second Letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians, beginning at the sixth verse [2 Thessalonians 3.6-13]*

In the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, we command you, brothers, to keep away from every brother who is idle and does not live according to the teaching you received from us. For you yourselves know how you ought to follow our example. We were not idle when we were with you, nor did we eat anyone's food without paying for it. On the contrary, we worked night and day, labouring and toiling so that we would not be a burden to any of you. We did this, not because we do not have the right to such help, but in order to make ourselves a model for you to follow. For even when we were with you, we gave you this rule: "If a man will not work, he shall not eat."

We hear that some among you are idle. They are not busy; they are busy bodies. Such people we command and urge in the Lord Jesus Christ to settle down and earn the bread they eat. And as for you, brothers, never tire of doing what is right.

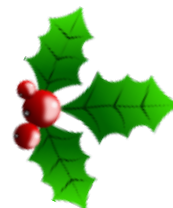
