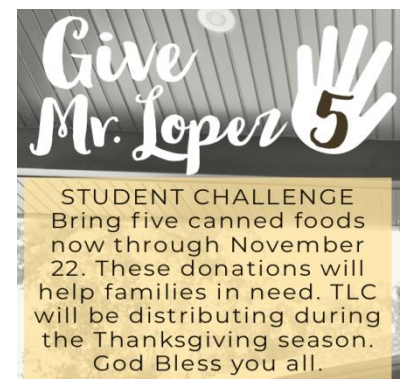


1st Annual Gentry Travelers take-n-bake Apple Pie Fundraiser!
