

Due to his expertise, he was selected to assist in the restructuring of the Postal Services Legacy systems. This required him to do extensive travel to support training at various locations throughout the United States. He retired at the early age of 52 to pursue other interests and endeavors. His last job was working at the JAX Beach Golf Course and as we know, he enjoyed that position because golf was his passion. He truly enjoyed assisting the other players with his knowledge of the game. One thing for sure was that he always remembered his roots and would occasionally come home to visit family and friends, but we knew it was really to get a Philly cheesesteak because he loved them so much. Also, let us not forget how he cheered on our Philadelphia Eagles!

He was preceded in death by his mother, Helen Sanford-Hicks; father, Willard F. Hicks Sr.; and four brothers: Willard F. Hicks, Jr., Glenn Hicks, Barry Hicks, and Gregory Hicks.

Ronnie leaves to cherish his memories: two sisters, Sheryl Hicks and Tina Herbert; two brothers, Robert Hicks, Sr., and Derek Hicks, Sr.; two aunts, Dorothy Hobbs and Shirlene Tucker; a host of cousins, including Donna Carson; many nieces and nephews, Sean, Erica, Amber, Robert Jr., Monique, Cynthia, Rashana, Angela, Derek Jr., Atiya, Aliya, Sharon, Cedric, Tasha, and Karriem; and a host of great-nieces and -nephews, and dear friends.
