Mr. Willie B. Middleton, affectionately known as "Farmer Brown," was born on April 5, 1937, to the late Edward and Lillie Mae Middleton. He departed this life on March 5, 2021, surrounded by his children.

He was educated in the Chatham County Public Schools and graduated from Woodville High School in 1955. At Woodville he was noted as one of the "greatest all around lineman to ever play there." His speed, strength and quickness ranked him among the best. He was inducted into the Woodville-Tompkins Athletic Hall of Fame in September 2017 for his stellar athletic performance.

As an adult he joined Second St. John Missionary Baptist Church where he served on the Usher and Trustee Boards. He is a retiree of the International Longshoremen Association Local 1414.
