Beverly is fondly remembered by her family as a strong and classy woman with an assertive personality and witty sense of humor. She enjoyed collecting fly swatters and was not afraid to use them! She always tried to be there to watch her grandkid's and great-grandkid's events. She was actively involved in the church throughout her life, teaching Sunday school and singing with her sisters.
