## Murry COOPER



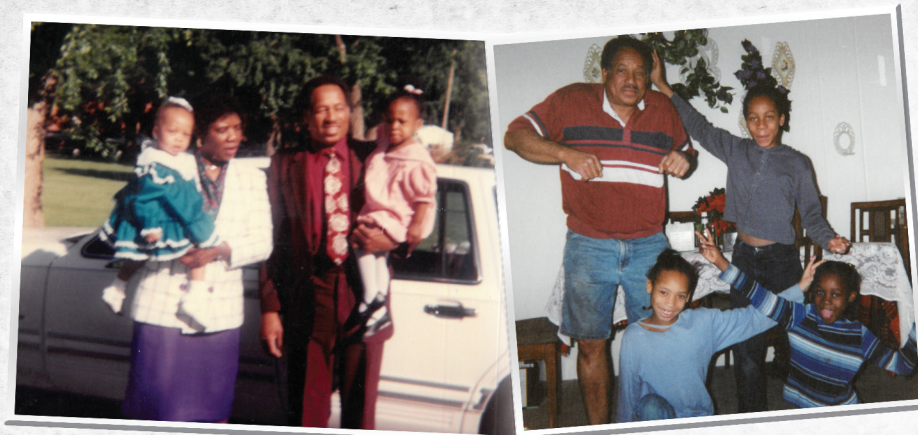
*To plant a seed in one's heart...
