She ministered, worked, and volunteered in Washington D.C. with an active affiliation with Allen Chapel AME, convicted by the Holy Spirit, she enrolled & graduated from the school of Divinity at Howard University to become ordained in 2006 & serve as a reverend, inspiring, encouraging & uplifting others. In 2016 she retired, moving back home to Savannah where she praised & worshiped at The Greater Gains AME church.
