But now it's time I traveled on alone.*

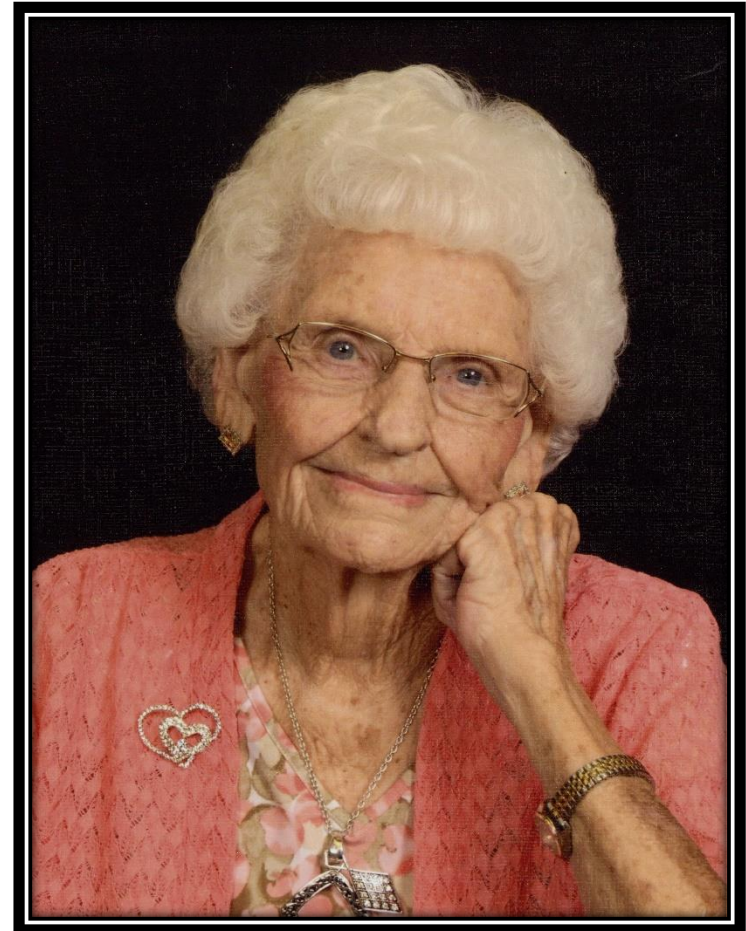
*So grieve a while for me, if grieve you must,
