TRUSTING that He will make all things right if I surrender to His will;



Richard Dean Hess was born on January 8, 1946 to Ralph and Frances (Winter) Hess in Pipestone, Minnesota where he lived and worked on the family farm until he was 10 years old. He attended school in Pipestone and graduated from Pipestone High School in 1964. While attending high school, he joined the National Guard and served for seven years as a Sergeant. In 1965, he moved to Sioux Falls, South Dakota where he began working at First Dakota National Bank as an Assistant Vice President. On September 2, 1967, he was united in marriage to Kathryn Olsen at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Pipestone. Following their marriage, they resided in Sioux Falls. He was unselfish and always willing to help anyone in their time of need, and was a devoted caretaker for his wife for 50 years.
