"Reed is here! He's back home!" And they all embraced their darling boy!

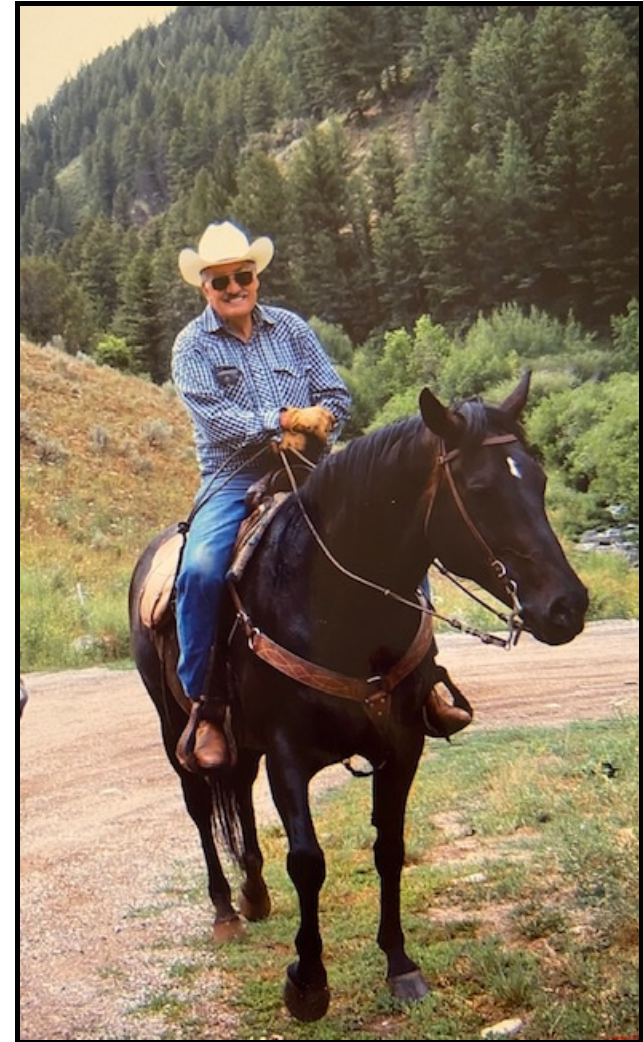
