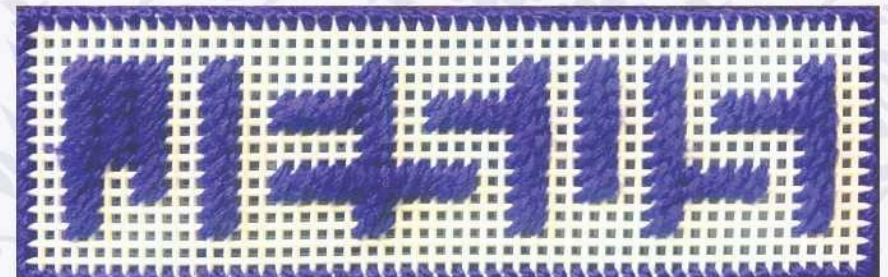

Laura Marquart, 86, of Bismarck, passed away August 14, 2019 in a Bismarck Hospital.
