Shirley was a member of the Petersburg Congregational Church near Lesterville which then merged into the United Church of Christ and recently the Scotland Community Church. She faithfully served the church as a 6th grade confirmation teacher, the church organist, sang in the church choir and directed the children's choir. Shirley was also a very active member of the women's fellowship and was their secretary for many years.
