Announcements-On Campus

To the concerned person that is feeding (overfeeding) the fish at the school - **Although we understand your concern that the fish look hungry and you feel they need to be fed, please understand that the fish are on a controlled diet and fed on a specific schedule. Overfeeding the fish is harmful and may actually be fatal to them.**

We have noticed that the tank on the right side (with the Tiger Barbs and live plants) was recently dosed with a *significant* overabundance of food. So much so that we are concerned that the chemical balance of the water has been negatively impacted. And actually, there was so much extra food in the tank (and this isn't the first time this has happened) that we believe a child may be responsible for the overfeeding, and this possibly occurred during one of the fellowship dinners or some other event at the school. With that in mind we ask that everyone keep an eye out and make sure that absolutely no one gets into the food in the cupboards under the fish tanks, or opens the lids on the top of the tanks. Water quality is critical in keeping the fish (and turtle) alive and overfeeding causes an excess of ammonia which is poisonous to these animals.
