The Obituary

Quincy C. Watson, at the age of 100, was called to his heavenly home on March 18, 2023.

Quincy (affectionately known as "QC") was born on June 13, 1922 in Wilsons Mills, NC, and grew up in Johnston County, North Carolina. He was an outstanding student and was accepted at Tuskegee Institute and attended for 3 years before entering the US Army in World War II. Serving from November 7, 1942 to January 23, 1946, he attained the rank of Technical Sergeant in the American Theater, Asiatic-Pacific, Bismarck Archipelago, Northern Solomons. He was awarded the Bronze Star with three Bronze Star Service Stars for heroic service.

After an Honorable Discharge from the US Army, he moved to Washington, D.C. where he worked as a cartographer at the Pentagon for both the US Army and later the US Air Force. Among his many awards and accomplishments, he received his Bachelor of Science degree and the Commander's Award for Civilian Service. He retired from the federal government after 36 years of dedicated service.

While working at the Pentagon, he met and married Imogene Watson and they raised a loving family together. Quincy served as a trustee at Trinity AME Zion Methodist Church in Washington, D.C. After retiring and moving to Richmond, VA, he became very active at Chamberlayne Heights United Methodist Church and volunteered on many community service projects. He was an avid reader, great cook, wonderful gardener, loved to sing and discuss world and national events. While in Richmond, he was famous amongst friends and family for his homemade scuppernong wine. Quincy and his wife Imogene moved to Raleigh, North Carolina in 2011 to be closer to his daughters and grandchildren.

Quincy had a strong faith in God, and it was exemplified not only in the way he lived his everyday life, but in his kind and gentle spirit towards everyone he came in contact with.

Quincy was preceded in death by his parents Joshua and Celia Watson; siblings Elizabeth, Betsy, Hattie and Buddy; wife Imogene Watson; son Barry Moore; son-in-law Loyal Ross; grandson Wayne Moore and great granddaughter Tameka.

He leaves to cherish his memory son Ronald Moore, daughters Brenda Bush (Barry Simms), and Sandra Ross; grandchildren Angalia Moore, Sabrina Jefferson (Lionel Jefferson), Brian Bush, Grace Moore and David Moore; great grandchildren Richard, Lia, Maya, Noah, and Miles; great-great grandchildren, and a host of nieces, nephews and friends.
