
All About Jesus - Revival Seminars

Seminar Details

We look forward to getting better acquainted with you, your members, and your guests as we partner together in seeking to draw nearer to Jesus. We join you in praying earnestly that the Holy Spirit will draw all of us into a deeper experience of renewal and revival. We offer the following items for your consideration as we plan and prepare for presenting the All About Jesus Revival Seminar in your church.

1. Since this is our full-time ministry, we prefer to travel when possible in our RV, which is set up as a home away from home. This creates less burden for us and the host church. In mild weather, it is possible for us to park in the church parking lot (if the church can provide water and 30-50 amp electricity) or a nearby campground, but in winter our expenses will include space rental at an RV park with full hook-ups.
2. We like to arrive on Thursday afternoon and get situated before dark.
3. We bring our own wireless microphones and appreciate being able to meet at the church with those in charge of the sound system on Thursday evening in order to get things hooked up and working properly. We also use PowerPoint presentations using our own computer and find it helpful to get that set up at the same time.
4. Most of the churches we have gone to have found it helpful to offer a light supper of soup, salad and bread on weekday evenings as an incentive to those who could be deterred by having to go home for supper after work.
5. Many churches have conducted a specific prayer ministry in conjunction with the meetings by providing daily opportunity for prayers of intercession, that the meetings and attendees be specially blessed by God's Spirit.
6. We make 13 presentations. A 6:30 p.m. starting time for all evening meetings seems to be the most user-friendly for families with children. Our first meeting is on a Friday evening. Except for Saturdays, presentations are given every evening (including Sunday) of the following week. On both Saturdays, we make 3 presentations. After several years of doing this, we have found one during Sabbath school, one during church, and one after a pot-luck, to be easiest on attendees.
7. Marji provides a children's feature at the beginning of each meeting (including church) and parents frequently report that their children look forward to her feature and the many stories that Lee includes in his presentations.
8. For meetings other than church, the following format seems to work quite well:
 - A) A welcome greeting and prayer by the pastor, elder, or designated person.
 - B) Venden's lead a theme song with lyrics on-screen and track accompaniment.
 - C) Marji presents children's feature.
 - D) Lee gives a presentation which concludes with a multi-media slide show / closing song.
 - E) Lee offers closing prayer.
9. On two occasions, following a meeting, the Venden's will make available helpful resources for purchase by those who are so inclined.
10. Sabbath pot-lucks after church, make it easier for guests to stay by for the afternoon meetings.
11. Attractive full color brochures may be purchased for use as bulletin inserts or invitations for prospective guests. We also have attractive 11x17 posters. Actual brochure cost (including printing, folding, tax and shipping) is about \$160 per 300 brochures. Posters are \$1 apiece. Cost/per decreases with larger orders.
12. If you choose to use the brochures we will need the following information to include when printing them:
 - A. Address where the meetings will be held.
 - B. Times you have selected for the meetings (evenings and Sabbath schedule).
 - C. Contact person (phone and email if available).
 - D. The number of brochures you wish to order.
 - E. Address where the brochures are to be shipped.
13. Arizona Conference (our sponsoring organization) has chosen to charge only for travel and camping related expenses, and then requests receipt of the entire contents of one freewill offering which is collected during our final meeting. Please do not deduct any of your church's expenses from this offering.
14. On our "Hosting a Seminar" menu, the brochure example reflects reduced resolution. Actual brochures have much sharper images and print.
