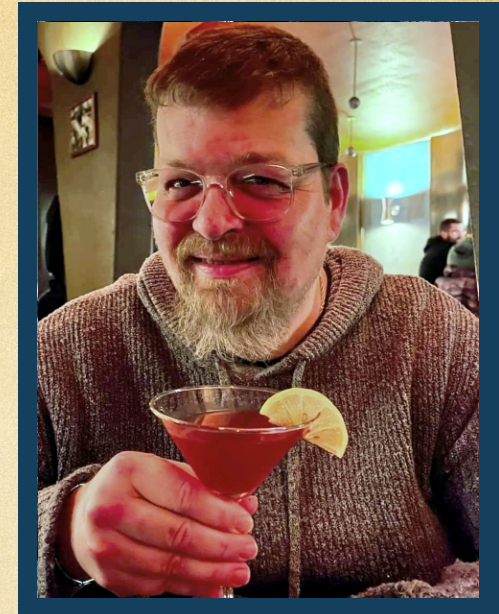

He made a big impact in their lives and was a confidant for them.
