She received her elementary education in Clinton and then continued high school at the West Central School of Agriculture in Morris through the 12<sup>th</sup> grade. JoAnn was united in marriage to Harold B. Anderson on October 13, 1951, at Trinity Lutheran Church in Clinton. The couple made their home on a farm near Hancock, Minnesota, where they welcomed six children. JoAnn was a proud farm wife, taking care of her home, her husband, and her children, until she began working outside of the home.
