The Pastor's Blog

April was both a blessed and challenging month. Let us start with the blessings. It was a blessing to take a week to revive ourselves in the hope of our risen Lord and also to welcome Isabelle and Mark to the family through baptism. A further blessing was to complete the much needed work on the roof at 2191 Benjamin Avenue. And what a blessing it is to see the youth meeting consistently for Next Level Adventist Youth (A.Y.) as well as to see them attend the Earth Day Summit. Thank you to the 42 participants, along with chaperones and the group leader. I was one of the presenters at the Summit and to have Ottawa Benjamin so well represented was indeed a blessing. We marveled at God's creation, understanding it through a lens of faith and *science rightly understood*.

On a personal note, it was a blessing for Ernell and I to transition into our home while we serve here in the Eastern district. We say thank you to so many who came out to help us with the move.
