When Ernest passed away in 1984, Myrtle remained on the farm for two years before moving to Lakeridge Townhomes in Alexandria, and later to Westbrook Townhomes also in Alexandria. During this time, Myrtle belonged to St. Mary's in Alexandria. She also joined Forada Seniors, enjoying cards and pot lucks. Myrtle also enjoyed many lunches with the Woolworth Girls, Newspaper Girls, and her other retired friends from J.C. Penney.

Ernest and Myrtle enjoyed dancing, going to the Lakeside weekly alongside other friends, and fishing -- both in the winter and summer. Myrtle enjoyed very much when her children, grandchildren, and great-grandkids came to visit and stay a few days. The kids especially loved the farm.
