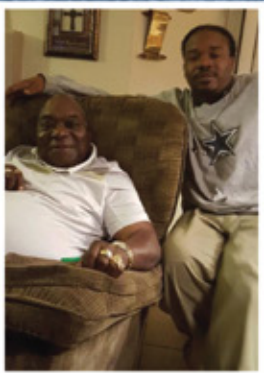
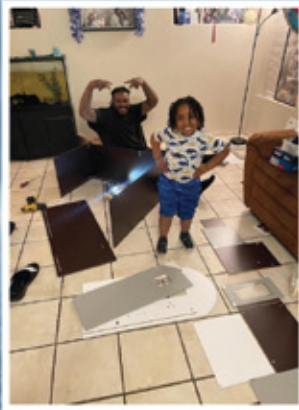
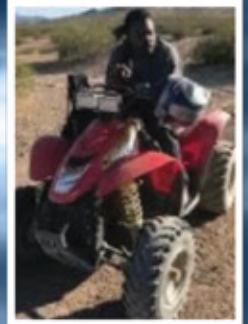

THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF LYNELL LAMOUNT VALLIEN, JR.

On January 11, 1984, Lynell Lamount Vallien, Jr., was born to Ora Denise and Lionel Vallien, Sr. in Frankfort, Germany. Lamount, as he was affectionately called by his family, was a natural-born leader and protector. He always made sure to check on those he loved and was always there when he was called. Lamount adored his family and was absolutely in love with his children. He enjoyed watching his beloved Dallas Cowboys play football and gaming with his buddies online. Lamount was known for his protective nature and his fun, witty spirit. He was quite possibly the funniest, most serious person you'd ever meet. He enjoyed spending time with his children and wrestling with them until laughter filled the air. He loved his family and was a proud, doting father. Lamount also loved to barbecue and was deemed a "rib professional," a title he was given by and shared with his son. Everybody loved those juicy, tender, fall-of-the-bone ribs. He dreamed of one day owning a food truck and learning to cook briskets as great as his grandfather. In 2022, he became the owner and founder of Patnaz Detail LLC mobile detailing company. Lamount was never afraid of hard work and aspired to grow the business into Patnaz Kitchen and Detail, owning a mobile detailing business and food truck. This dream, he passed on to his son who is the keeper of the secret rib recipe. Lamount was a creature of habit; he was either always home or always working. He was a strong supporter, especially when it came to uplifting the youth. In his free time, he coached the defensive line for the Rams Pop Warner Football team, coached on his son's T-Ball team, or attended games and cheer competitions for his girls. Boy, did he love watching his children grow.

Lamount attended Cheyenne High School and played offensive and defensive linemen on the Desert Shields Football team. There, he coined the name "L Boogie" for his celebratory dancing after he delivered a hard hit. "Boog," as he became known by his friends, was easy to talk to, had sound advice, and always had an encouraging word— a solid dude. He was a loyal and honest person that always had their backs. After graduating from Cheyenne High School in 2002, he went on to pursue a certification as a pharmacy tech.

Lamont was a faith-filled man and was not afraid to speak of the goodness of the Lord. After joining New Antioch Church of God in Christ in 2020, he answered the call to become a Deacon under the leadership of Pastor Bobby Moore. As a Deacon he served as the doorman, greeter, and "church security guard" as his son liked to call him. "Deacon Lynell" as he was affectionately known, loved to participate in the church, and was a willing worker. He played Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in the black history month play, and recently, Big Jesus in the church's Christmas play. In addition to working in the church, Deacon Lynell was employed with Glide Installations as a modular installer. He never missed a day of work and was happy to learn more about the trade each day. He took his work seriously and could lift a ton— Call Lynell; he would get the job done. Previously, he worked for ABS Facility Services and Blue Ribbon Specialties, Inc. of Las Vegas, NV. He loved his job and the guys he got to make fun of every day.

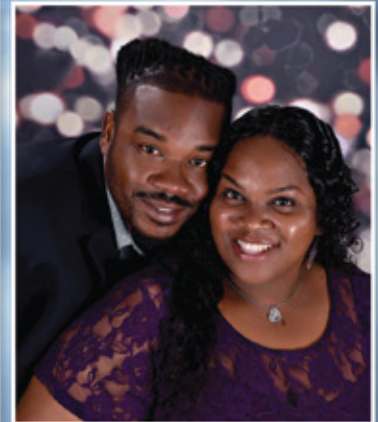

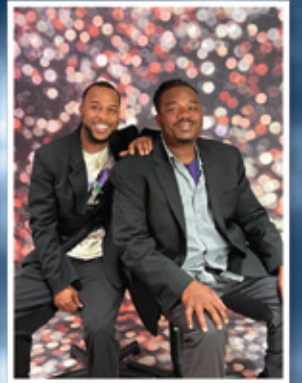
