


Celebrating A Life Well Lived

He is survived by his loving wife of nearly 50 years, Carole; devoted son Clinton and wife Tara; cherished granddaughters Lillie and Kendall; daughter-in-law Kim; sister Janice; as well as numerous cousins, nieces, nephews, and friends.


