

One of Cheryll's greatest joys was being a mom and her love for her children was unmatched. Cheryll was "The Cool Mom", so much in fact that even the other neighborhood children would come spend time with her, partake in "Burrito Night" with one of her burritos with green chili, get beaten in a game of jacks, all while listening to the latest music. Her children will always remember the countless sporting events she came to, how she celebrated all their achievements, her beaming with pride at their graduations, and that she was always the best cheerleader. She never missed an opportunity to be present at every event that she could attend. In her later years, her grandchildren, Aiya Celestial and Ysis Serena, were an additional source of joy in her life.





In her spare time, Cheryll enjoyed listening to good music, traveling, and enjoying the company of her family and close friends.
