Write down their responses.	Make a recipe with an adult and use measuring spoons and cups. Double the recipe, if possible! Take a picture of the recipe and the food!	Use Play-doh or Legos to make a creation. Take a picture of it or bring it to school.

Read aloud to a sibling or parent for at least 20 minutes. Talk about the book. Record in your planner what book it was.	Write out your spelling words 3 times each.	Practice your times tables for 20-30 minutes using flash cards or an app, if you have it.	Draw a picture of the layout of your bedroom. Pretend you are a designer and you have to re-design your room!
Read the first 3 chapters of one of the gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John). Write down a timeline of 4 important events in those chapters.	Find a magazine or newspaper. Circle all the proper nouns you can find. Underline all the verbs and put a star next to any verbs you've never heard of before! Take a picture of it or bring it to school.	Write a full page letter (skip lines) to a third grader letting them know what to expect in the fourth grade. What tips do you have for them to have a great year? What things are harder than you expected? What do you enjoy most?	Find a tape measure and measure the height of all the furniture in your room (cm) and your living room. Then put them in order from greatest to least heights.	Do something active for 30 minutes! Watch an exercise video, play a sport, dance, or anything else that gets your heart pumping! Go! Record what you did in your planner.
