She attended country school near the family farm for six years and then attended parochial school at St. Joseph's in Grenville through the eighth grade. She went on to Webster High School, graduating in 1945. After high school, she moved to Rapid City and worked as an office secretary at the National Guard Headquarters.

On October 12, 1948, she was united in marriage to Kenneth Erickson at St. Ottos Catholic Church in Webster. The couple made their home on a farm near Bristol, raising seven children. In 1970, she started working at Sun Dial Manor. While working there she took correspondence courses earning her dietary supervisor certificate through the University of Florida. After retiring she moved to Aberdeen in 1992 to babysit her grandchildren. In 1994 she moved to Webster, living at Downtown Manor. She worked at Lake Area Hospital as cook until retiring again in 2003.
