illiam Peter McKernan was born on November 11, 1942, in Milbank, SD. He was the son of Emmett H. McKernan and Catherine Barbara (Huneger) McKernan. Bill grew up in Milbank. He attended St. Lawrence School and Milbank High School, graduating with the Class of 1961. He attended Southeast Technical College in Sioux Falls.

Bill served in the United States Army from 1967 until 1969. He was awarded the National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with three Bronze Service Stars, and Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal. Following his honorable discharge, Bill returned to South Dakota.

Bill worked in the insurance business, first for Milbank Mutual in Milbank, then for Presidential Insurance in Sioux Falls, SD. He later worked for Western Bank in Sioux Falls, Sioux Falls School District, and Stone Container. Due to health reasons, Bill moved back to Milbank in 2004. He was a member of St. Lawrence Catholic Church and a member of the VFW.
