

Reverend Louis Paul Jolivette (Rev) was born in Franklin, LA and raised in Four Corners, LA under the rule of his loving parents Abel and Leola Jolivette. During the late 70's under the leadership of Reverend E. L. Burnside he was born again; and ran the race with endurance until his last breath. He is the founder of Joy Missionary Baptist Church, 4531 Yellowstone Blvd. Houston, TX.

Rev had 6 children. At an early age he welcomed son Van Brown. His first union blessed him with three daughters: Delphine, Debra, and Sandra. His second union blessed him with two sons: Louis Jr and Lamont.



He married Evangelist Matilda Jolivette (Stevens) in 1985, a native of Ville Platte, LA and was empowered with 36 years of marital bliss. This union also blessed him with Christopher, Sharon, and Evelyn. Together in 1997 he and his bride built and laid the unshakable foundation known today as Joy Missionary Baptist Church. Coupled with; Jolivette's Personal Care Home, M & L Boarding House, A1 Fresh Start Outreach and Jolivette & Son Fencing. As they continued in the vision set before them, God enlarged their territory. They began to feed thru JMBC Restoration Outreach Ministry & Feeding. Together they ministered to the inner-city youth and the homeless, both locally and regionally. They provided spiritual therapy to those addicted to drugs and habits, introducing them to a hope against hope. He also supported the Prison Outreach Ministry.

It's me, Jr. It's hard to sit here and pour my heart


out while it's broken in two. I still find myself waiting for you to call me in the mornings to ask,


